School Admissions

Special education services shall be available to children with identified disabilities between the ages of three (3) and twenty-two (22) who are enrolled in member districts.

High school districts shall be financially responsible for the education of resident students with disabilities who have received an eighth grade graduation certificate or when such students have reached the age of fifteen (15) years, before the first day of school of their home district.

Homeless Children

Any homeless child shall be immediately admitted, even if the child or child's parent/guardian is unable to produce records normally required for enrollment.
