Academic Life Skills Programs (ALSP)

The Academic Life Skills Programs are for students identified with cognitive, physical, or multiple impairments. These programs use a trans-disciplinary team model in supporting the needs of students with developmental difficulties.

Social Support Programs (SSP)

The Social Support Programs are for students with behavioral-emotional needs and use a model of teaching that integrates pro-social behaviors and clinical interventions via a team model for supporting the varied needs of students.

Language and Social Skills Opportunities Programs (LASSO)

The Language and Social Skills Opportunities Programs address the needs of students who are at or near grade level academically but require support with communication, sensory regulation, and social skills.

Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE)

The Early Childhood Special Education Program serves 3-5 year old students who are eligible for special education. The halfday program provides individualized interventions to support students across academic, communication, motor, social, behavioral, and daily living skills domains.
